RegPharmNZ FPS MRPharmS MHSc(Distn) PGDipClinPharm(Distn) FNZCP MCAPA

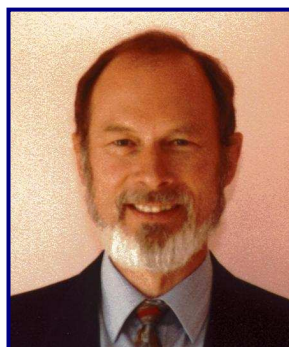
