Elizabeth Plant – National President

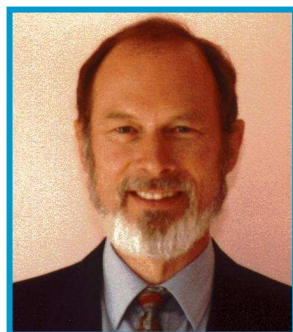
RegPharmNZ MPS MRPharmS MHSc(Distr) PGDipClinPharm FNZCP
