WHAT NEXT?

- Choose the right subjects. Although you should check precise entry requirements with individual universities, you will normally need to have studied science (especially chemistry and biology) and maths.
- Speak with your careers advisor.
- Check out the websites of the Schools of Pharmacy for entry requirements and what it's like to study at the different universities.
- Work experience contact your local pharmacy to see if they'll let you experience pharmacy in action.
