Requirements for Pharmacy Equipment

New Zealand Government

When considering an application for a Licence to Operate Pharmacy, Section 51(1)(e) of the Medicines Act 1981 requires the Licensing Authority to be satisfied that the equipment available at the premises is suitable and adequate. The Licensing Authority specifies the following dispensary equipment and reference resources which all licensed pharmacies must have on site and readily accessible. These are the minimum requirements to comply with section 51(1)(e) relating to equipment. Compliance is monitored by Medicines Control through auditing activities.

Dispensary equipment

All equipment must be in a suitable condition and be maintained (including regular checks, validation and/or calibration as applicable).

Dispensary equipment

Electronic dispensing system with printer producing legible and durable labels containing the pharmacy identifiable information.

Refrigerator for storing medicines requiring refrigeration within the range 2-8°C (use of a pharmaceutical grade refrigerator is recommended).

Temperature monitoring equipment for the monitoring of maximum and minimum temperatures in all areas of the pharmacy used to store pharmaceuticals (including refrigerators).

Tablet counting trays (minimum two) including suitable spatulas. Dedicated equipment must be used to dispense cytotoxic medicines.

Stamped glass measures¹ (minimum three) including a 10ml measure, either a 25ml or 50ml measure, and a 100ml measure.

Scales of an equivalent accuracy to a Class 2 balance (beam or electronic) and which turn at 10mg. Scales must be certified annually.

Metric weights comprising an appropriate set (10mg to 500g) if using a beam balance or at least two weights for validation purposes if using an electronic balance. All weights must be certified annually.

Ointment slab

Spatulas (minimum two) for use when compounding (spatulas with steel handles are recommended).

Stirring rod

Mortar and pestle

Controlled drugs safe² meeting the requirements of regulation 28 of the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 1977.

Controlled drugs register in a form complying with Regulation 37(2)(a) or Regulation 39 of the Misuse of Drugs Regulations 1977.

Any other equipment necessary for appropriate provision of services from the premises. This includes, for example appropriate validated measuring device(s) for opioid substitution treatment dispensing services, a still air box for aseptic dispensing services, required equipment for vaccination services.

¹ Stamped glass measures are marked with an official stamp (e.g. the Crown stamp) under the Weights and Measures Act 1987.

 $^{^2}$ Steel safes must comply with the 'Requirements for the Custody of Controlled Drugs: Steel Safes'.

Reference resources

A pharmacy must have appropriate reference resources readily accessible at the premises covering each of the categories as specified in the following table. Reference resources may be accessed in a printed or electronic form. Where electronic resources are used, the pharmacy staff must be able to demonstrate knowledge of how to access and use the resources. The inside covers of all printed reference resources are required to be marked with the pharmacy dispensing stamp.

Where access to the current version or edition is not specified, reference resources must have been published within five years.
